Mrs Caswell was born in South Kingstown on October 26, 1832 in the old Gardiner Homestead in the Boston Neck Area, a daughter of Rowland F and Martha Gardiner, one of eleven children. The homestead is supposed to be the birthplace also of the famous Hannah Robinson and headquarters of Lafayette.

Mrs. Caswell married Wm. G. Caswell on October 3, 1853; they had two children, W. Herbert Caswell and Miss Addie Caswell, both of Narragansett.

She was a member of St Peter's and was instrumental in the inception of St Peter's Aid society of which she was a member and was a great church worker all her life

Mrs Caswell died at her home Windemere on April 15, 1908, funeral being held from St Peter's Church with Rev. W H B Allen officiating at the funeral and burial was in Riverside cemetery, Wakefield. Her survivors were her son, W. Herbert Caswell and daughter Miss Addie Caswell, both at home.
